

# Changed Life, Changed Mind

Life is full of change. Sometimes, the change is something we anticipate and want, and other times, it's something we could never have predicted and definitely would not choose. We know that God has a time for everything and therefore a purpose for every life He creates. However, in the midst of an unplanned pregnancy, the mothers who come to the PRC often cannot see past how a baby would change their life in ways they had not planned.

That was the case for Ruby\*. She called the PRC, frantic and on the verge of tears, wanting to know information about abortions. The receptionist told her we do not perform or refer for abortions and then shared the services we offer. Ruby decided to come for the free pregnancy test.

Ruby arrived at our clinic tearful and confused, especially when the test confirmed she was indeed pregnant. Clearly overwhelmed, she kept saying, "I don't know what to do." Ruby shared that she never believed in abortion until she was faced with this unexpected pregnancy. She was already a mother and didn't want the changes another child would bring. In addition, she felt that she and her boyfriend had not been dating long enough to be ready for a baby.

The client advocate invited her to slow down and think through

the specifics of her decision, including an invitation to return for an ultrasound. Ruby agreed to come back. Before she left, the client advocate offered to pray with Ruby. She accepted, tearing up again during the prayer and expressing her appreciation afterwards.

A few weeks later Ruby came back in, this time joined by the father of the baby. Her demeanor had changed drastically. Ruby was no longer tearfully frantic, but calm and at ease, telling the nurse that in the weeks she'd had to think about the pregnancy, she and her boyfriend began leaning more towards parenting. Ruby smiled through the ultrasound, making a connection with her baby. Ruby made the brave choice to parent.

I don't know what to do," she kept saying. She didn't want the changes another child would bring.

We have the privilege of seeing stories like this over and over. Stories of how the Lord can make an unborn life – even an unplanned one – beautiful in *His* time to the women and men who come into our clinics. We know He is the one who changes the hearts and minds of our clients through life-revealing ultrasound, the compassionate words of a client advocate or nurse, or even through other means outside our clinic doors. Often, it is time itself that seems to make a difference for women considering abortion. As they slow down, they recognize that although a baby will bring change, it's a change they can handle with help and support.

#### **Technology**

In addition to providing professional medical services to our clients,

we also seek to present quality medical resources to educate them with information relevant to their health. During medical appointments, we are able to use iPads to show clients more information from credible sources. For pregnancy test clients, particularly those who are too early to receive an ultrasound, we use information on the Endowment of Human Development website, which shows 3D video footage of an unborn child at each week of pregnancy. This interactive platform is a great supplement to ultrasound that allows our clients to see fetal development firsthand and opens doors for us to talk further with them about their pregnancy.

The PRC is seeking volunteers to facilitate our education classes


